PROGRAM STRUCTURE

Students will emerge from the AHEC Scholars program having gained innovative, interprofessional training focused on transforming primary care and improving patient care.

Students will:

- Participate for at least 2-years upon admission to the AHEC Scholars program and culminating with graduation from the student's academic program.
- Complete a minimum of 40 hours of experiential and 40 hours of didactic training during each of the two years of the program.
- Complete a follow-up evaluation one year after exiting the program.

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY

Graduate health professions students from the following disciplines are encouraged to apply and participate in AHEC Scholars. Applications are accepted in the Fall, Spring and Summer of each year. Preferred application times are listed for each training programs below:

- Dental Medicine 2nd or 3rd Year
- Master of Social Work 1st Year
- Medicine 2nd or 3rd year

- Nurse Practitioner 1st or 2nd Year (for programs over 2 years)
- Pharmacy 3rd Year
- Physician Assistant Studies 1st Year
